

TO RESTORE OLD CHURCH.

Effort Being Made to Raise Funds to Put Historic North Hillsdale Edifice Into Original Condition.—Meeting May Be called.

Efforts are being made by several prominent people of this vicinity to raise funds for the purchase of the North Hillsdale Baptist church. For some years it has been owned by private parties, but at the present time it has been deemed advisable to restore this old, historic building to its original state as near as possible. An option has been secured on the property and an effort is being made to raise money to pay the price. The plans are, when it is once restored, to use it for any good public purpose. The building stands on a beautiful site on the North Hillsdale road, four miles above the village, and in the course of a few years a new state road will pass it. The building was well built, and is yet in a condition that with little repair will stand for years to come. The descendants of the people who once attended services there are anxious for the restoration of the building and citizens interested are requested to help. It is expected that a meeting will soon be held to which the public will be urged to attend. At this meeting it is hoped to have a person present from New York who has been interested in the restoration of historic places. At this meeting an association will be formed to take over the property and look after it.
